the battle for gallipoli was officially described as one of the world s classic tragedies and in this book the participants tell the full story of this failed offensive the bitter campaign against the turks was ill conceived inadequately equipped and never likely to succeed

the scene was tragically macabre the image of desolation the flames spared nothing as for our young men a few minutes ago so alert so self confident all now lying dead on the bare deck blackened burned skeletons twisted in all directions no trace of any clothing the fire having devoured all vice admiral p e guette recalls the damage to the french ship suffen during a naval battle in 1915 one of the most famous battles in history gallipoli forced churchill from office established turkey s iconic founder mustafa kemal ataturk and marked australia s emergence as a nation in its own right it had begun as a bold move led by the british to ultimately capture constantinople but this definitive new history explains that from the initial landings which ended with so much blood in the sea it could be seen from aircraft overhead to the desperate attacks of early summer and the battle of attrition that followed it was a lunacy that was never going to succeed drawing on unpublished personal accounts by individuals at all levels and from all sides not only from britain australia and new zealand but unusually from turkey and france too peter hart combines his trademark eye for vivid personal stories with a strong narrative to bring a modern view of this military disaster to a popular audience

the british led mediterranean expeditionary force that attacked the ottoman empire at gallipoli in 1915 was a multi national affair including australian new zealand irish french and indian soldiers ultimately a failure the campaign ended with the withdrawal of the allied forces after less than nine months and the unexpected victory of the ottoman armies and their german allies in britain the campaign led to the removal of churchill from his post as first lord of the admiralty and the abandonment of the plan to attack germany via its soft underbelly in the east thereafter it was largely forgotten on a national level commemorated only in specific localities linked to the campaign in post war turkey by contrast the memory of gallipoli played an important role in the formation of a turkish national identity celebrating both the ordinary soldier and the genius of the republic s first president mustafa kemal the campaign served a similarly important formative role in both australia and new zealand where it is commemorated annually on anzac day for the southern irish meanwhile the bitter memory of service for the king in a botched campaign was forgotten for decades shaped initially by the imperatives of war time and the needs of the grief stricken and the bereft the memory of gallipoli has been re made time and again over the last century for the turks an inspirational victory for many on the allied side a glorious and romantic defeat for others still an episode best forgotten gallipoli has meant different things to different people serving by turns as an occasion of sincere and heartfelt sorrow an opportunity for

separatist and feminist protest and a formative influence in the forging of national identities

traditional methods of studying the past have always given greater importance to nationalist religious and moral interests which subordinated the historical fact to the system point of view the time has come to simplify and show respect for our ancestors striving to know what really happened in the past and not just what they want to inform us about after so many years of studying history i came to the conclusion that the best study system is through an impartial objective chronology that just put each event in its exact place in time revealing history without manipulation this chronology contains not only purely political facts such as the foundation of cities the birth of kingdoms and empires scientific and geographical discoveries natural disasters and epidemics it also includes information on the most different fields of human activity chemistry astronomy geography mathematics and so on in parallel the chronology is complemented by data that do not belong to a specific date but to an entire epoch they are each society generalities curiosities customs the religion of each civilization inventions or discoveries that cannot be placed in an exact date etc the result of all this set is one of the most complete chronologies within its reach periodically updated with the latest archaeological and scientific discoveries and that transforms the reader into an eyewitness of the past understanding the relation of geographically distant facts to each other but closely connected in time and influencing unexpected consequences this is something that traditional history has generally ignored when it was not usable a work of this magnitude could not be published in a single book so i have divided it into several collections and the spanish originals are being translated into french english italian and portuguese the chronology goes from prehistory to the present day year by year as far as possible for those who prefer a deeper and more detailed study i have prepared a second chronology day by day which for now covers from 1789 to 1946 divided into five collections
